

YOUR PATHWAY TO A DEGREE FROM THE UNIVERSITY OF SOUTH AUSTRALIA

Eynesbury offers different options which will allow you to bridge the gap between secondary and tertiary study – the Foundation Studies Program (FSP), which you can enter after completing the equivalent of Year 11 – and a range of diploma programs which are suitable if you have attempted the last year of High School.

If you choose to study the FSP you are given provisional entry into a bachelor degree program of your choice at

the University of South Australia. Upon achievement of the required entry score for your nominated degree program, you are given entry into the University for the next intake period. The Diploma of Business, and the Diploma of Computing and Information Technology provide the necessary skills, knowledge and understanding that enables you to articulate into year 2 of a range of degree programs at the University of South Australia.



The University of South Australia is a progressive international university with a 150-year history, supporting a vibrant student community from around the world.

The University of South Australia (UniSA) has quickly established a global reputation for the quality and creativity of its graduates and the innovative, outcomes-focused relevance of its research.

It is Australia's youngest university to be ranked in the Times Higher Education's (THE) top 50 of world universities under 50-years-old. QS also placed the university in the world's top three per cent, one of only three Australian institutions under the age of 25 to feature in that world's best list.

The University has also been given a 5 star rating for Excellence in the 2015 QS World University Rankings in the areas of teaching, facilities, internationalisation, innovation and inclusiveness.

With approximately 34,000 students – about 6,000 of whom are international – it is South Australia's biggest university, and offers more than 400 degree programs in arts, business, law, education, engineering, the environment, health sciences, information technology and social sciences.

Programs are designed with a strong professional emphasis and include fieldwork, placements, industry-guided simulations and business projects.

This real-world experience provides students with the qualities that employers look for and the University's graduate employment rates are above the national average.


The campus is home to studies in health sciences, construction, planning and environmental studies.



Eynesbury Foundation Studies Program

Since 1994, Eynesbury has provided the Foundation Studies Program (FSP) on behalf of the University of South Australia (UniSA).

When you are studying the FSP you are also given a conditional offer to study a bachelor degree program of your choice at UniSA. Upon achievement of the required entry score for your chosen program you will gain entry into the university at the next intake period*.

Certificate IV in Tertiary Preparation Program

The Certificate IV in Tertiary Preparation Program prepares you for entry into an Eynesbury diploma. This is the ideal preparation if you have completed Australian Year 11 or the equivalent and

require further study before starting a diploma. The courses you study have a direct relevance to your chosen bachelor degree and are an introduction to the courses that you will study in your diploma.

Diploma of Business

The Diploma of Business is made up of the same courses that are taught in the first year of business degrees at UniSA. It introduces you to the fundamental knowledge and range of study skills required to complete the full range of undergraduate business degree programs at the university.

Diploma of Computing and Information Technology

The Diploma of Computing and Information Technology is made up of the same courses that taught in the first year of computing and IT degrees at UniSA. It will provide you with the necessary skills,

knowledge and understanding required to move into a range of undergraduate degree programs at the university.

Eynesbury College Academy of English

The Eynesbury College Academy of English (ECAE) provides high-quality English Language programs that are taught by qualified Teachers of English to Speakers of Other Languages (TESOL). ECAE is a member of English Australia and accredited by the Australian Government.

Program accreditation

Living in Adelaide

South Australia is a sophisticated, modern and affordable place to live, work and study. The capital city of Adelaide has all the hallmarks of a major urban centre with modern and classical architecture, a bustling retail hub and a multi-cultural population.

For five years in succession, Adelaide has featured amongst the world's 10 most liveable cities according to an annual report released by the Economist Intelligence Unit's Global Liveability Survey. Importantly, Adelaide has also been rated Australia's safest city according to statistics compiled for the Suncorp Bank Friendly City Report.

The city has wide streets and central squares ringed by 900 hectares of lush parklands.

In every sense this layout sets the scene for modern-day life in Adelaide. Traffic is rarely congested, people are relaxed and friendly, the air is clean and the public transport system can take you to the city's white, sandy beaches or the Adelaide Hills within half an hour.

Adelaide is Australia's festival city and prides itself on art and culture.

There is plenty to see and do while living in Adelaide:

- Music and cultural festivals and events are popular, with Adelaide hosting local and international acts throughout the year, including the internationally renowned Adelaide Festival of Arts, Adelaide Fringe and and the WOMADelaide world music festival.
- The Adelaide Central Market is the city's most visited tourist attraction offering over 80 stalls and has been the centre for multi-cultural cuisine for over 140 years.
- Adelaide is Australia's food and wine capital, with more restaurants per capita than any other Australian city. The city is a popular venue for national and international sporting events, including international cricket matches and the Tour Down Under cycling race.
- Adelaide offers a world-class art gallery and museum, live theatre and music complexes, a vibrant nightclub district and a major entertainment centre.

Cost of living

The cost of living in Adelaide is lower than in any other mainland capital city in Australia. Living expenses for an international student in Adelaide will vary depending on individual lifestyle, but can be expected to be:

- 25 percent less expensive than living in Melbourne
- 24 percent less expensive than living in Sydney
- 11 percent less expensive than living in Perth
- 10 percent less expensive than living in Brisbane.

With a pleasant Mediterranean climate, Adelaide has hot dry summers and wet cold winters.

It doesn't snow in Adelaide but it does get pretty cold and wet in winter. Umbrellas and waterproof jackets are essential when you are out and about in the winter months.

Your student life

Student support services

Eynesbury is committed to helping students achieve their goals by offering comprehensive student support services. Eynesbury has a dedicated team of student support staff who provide a range of services, information, personal support and counselling to students throughout their studies at Eynesbury.

Eynesbury encourages all students to engage with the friendly student support services staff and contact them for assistance when needed.

Once enrolled, Eynesbury offers a compulsory orientation program for all new students. During orientation students will:

- choose and enrol in courses and create their own timetable
- meet staff and current students
- get to know new classmates
- receive student ID card, and
- tour the campus facilities.

Student experience program

Eynesbury prides itself on providing an outstanding student experience by integrating events and activities into student life.

Eynesbury's Student Experience Coordinator is committed to offering a wide range of social and recreational activities that encourage local and international students to socialise together. These activities are often where friendships are forged, networks are established and life long memories are made.

The Student Experience program caters to all students and involves the following activities:

Your accommodation

Students coming to Adelaide for the first time are encouraged to live in accommodation arranged by Eynesbury on arrival.

Finding suitable accommodation, in a convenient location, is important and may take time. Factors such as budget, length of stay and whether you want to live alone or with others will influence your decision. It is a good idea to begin considering accommodation options well before arrival in Adelaide.

Adelaide boasts a wide range of accommodation options to suit different budgets and tastes.

These options include homestay, student hostels, student apartments and private rental.

Homestay

There are two options for homestay:

- **Full board** from \$240 per week* – most meals provided
- **Part board** from \$150 per week* – no meals provided – use of kitchen facilities to prepare meals

Homestay accommodation provides students the opportunity to live with an Australian family. Students living in this environment are introduced to Australian culture and have the best opportunity of developing language skills by using English on a regular basis in everyday situations.

All Eynesbury approved homestay hosts have met selected criteria and come from a diverse range of cultures, backgrounds and family structures. If you are a student under 18-years-old and choose homestay accommodation you will need to remain on full board until you turn 18. Students in Years 10 or 11 must live in Eynesbury approved accommodation regardless of age.

Students will be provided with a fully furnished room, shared use of bathroom, laundry and negotiated use of kitchen facilities. Internet and phone costs are not included in the weekly fee – usage and costs need to be negotiated with the homestay host.

Homeaway (under 18 student accommodation)

- **Full board** – \$294 per week*

Eynesbury has a purpose built, environmentally friendly student residence available to students who are under 18 years of age.

Eynesbury Homeaway aims to provide a 'home away from home' for international students just three kilometres from the city centre of Adelaide.

Homeaway offers fully catered accommodation where all meals are provided.

All bedrooms are fully furnished with quality built-ins comprising of a single bed complete with mattress, under bed lockable storage, double wardrobe, study bench with a lockable drawer and chair, bookshelves, a reverse-cycle air-conditioner and a refrigerator.

Student residence

- **Part board** from \$135–\$155 per week* share bathroom/\$190 per week* ensuite bathroom
- **Full board** from \$240.00 per week*

Student residences usually offer single bedroom accommodation, however, some offer a limited number of twin or double rooms.

Bedrooms are fully furnished and students have access to shared kitchen and bathroom facilities, laundry, lounge and recreational activities.

Most residences are self-catering, however there are some that provide meals.

Internet is available for an additional cost at all residences.

Gas, electricity and water are generally included in the set fee. Some residences provide a private telephone line in each room with an additional point for computer use. Students are responsible for the costs associated with these services if they choose to connect.

Most residences are located in suburban areas of Adelaide so students will need to budget for public transport costs.

Residences offer different lengths of stay varying from daily, weekly, 3, 6 or 12-month leases or on a semester or academic year basis. A bond is payable on arrival.

Student apartments

- **Part board** from \$240–\$350 per week*

Student apartments are purpose built student accommodation facilities, situated off campus and managed by private companies. These facilities offer fully-furnished, self-contained apartments with an opportunity to live alone or share with others in a student community.

In addition to rent, students may need to budget for additional expenses including:

- gas
- electricity
- phone
- internet.

Student apartments are offered on a six or 12 month fixed term lease agreement.

Private accommodation

Finding quality and affordable accommodation in the private rental market can be difficult, particularly when making the transition to a new country and adjusting to the demands of academic programs.

It is for this reason that Eynesbury recommends all students live in accommodation arranged by Eynesbury on arrival, as searching for permanent housing in an unfamiliar city can be a time consuming and stressful process.


However, renting a house or apartment can be a less expensive option, particularly if sharing with others. You will need to factor in to your budget additional costs such as food, electricity, gas, internet, phone and furniture.

It is a good idea to conduct some research into the local private rental market before arriving in Adelaide and to begin your search for appropriate rental housing shortly after arrival, as the process can take time.

Leases are usually for six or 12 months, with a refundable bond of four to six weeks rent in advance.

It is important to note that these private facilities are not arranged by the Eynesbury Accommodation Office and care should be taken when entering into private contracts.


